Design a Jumper Competition

Thank you for registering to be a part of the 2026 WA Football Design a Jumper Competition. The competition will be open until Friday, July 3, 2026 and entries can be sent in at any time prior to the end date. Below is your application package, with instructions and contact details if you need them. Good luck and we look forward to seeing your entries!

Aim: Get students to demonstrate a sense of school pride/identity and get involved in football in a cross-curricular manner, perhaps engaging those who would not necessarily excel in a traditional sports environment.

Competition Requirements

Entries close **Friday July 3, 2026**

Students must be enrolled in Yr 1-6 at the entering school.

Maximum **2 entries** per school.

Entries must be done on the **templates provided**.

Entries must be accompanied by a short reflection on the reasons for the design.

Due to this, we recommend students pay attention to local landmarks, their school ethos and location as well as population demographics when constructing their design.

Please note: Any student designs that contain traditional Aboriginal artwork (sometimes referred to as “dot-paintings”) can only be submitted if they were created by a student who identifies as being Aboriginal, due to sensitive cultural reasons. Teachers are not permitted to submit any non-Aboriginal student designs that contain traditional Aboriginal artwork.

We require the jumper design to be scanned and submitted online via the link provided.

Entries will be judged by a judging panel from WA Football.


The two schools sending in the best entries will receive a set of jumpers in the winning design made by ISC: one regional school and one metropolitan school.
